1. THE TRANSJU' EVENT

La Transjurassienne event takes place every year, the second weekend of February. Races belong to the regional, national, and international (FIS and Visma Ski Classics Challenger) Ski calendars.

1.1 RACES INFORMATION

Races are open to all men and women, with or without a FIS or FFS ski licence of:

- 18 years old minimum for 25km CT and 25km FT races
- 21 years old minimum for 50km CT and 50km FT races

La Transju'Expérience is open to all men and women of:

- 16 years old minimum for 25km CT et 25km FT distances, minors must provide parental authorization with registration.

➤ Ultra-Trans

The UltraTrans challenge combines the two main races of the Transju' weekend:

La Transju'Classic (50km Classic technique) on Saturday + La Transjurassienne (70km Free Technique) on Sunday.

1.2 THE RACECOURSE

In the case of insufficient snow, the organization reserves the right to modify the course and provide an alternative track. Intermediate sprints will take place along the racecourse (1 for La Transju'Classic and 1 for La Transjurassienne).

In case of worsening of the sanitary situation, the organization committee reserves the right to modify the races' program. For example, the races on Saturday could be moved to Sunday or vice-versa or the departure times could be changed or stagger. This list is not exhaustive.

2. REGISTRATION AND ENTRY FEES

2.1 RACE REGISTRATION AND MANDATORY DOCUMENTS

Only online registrations are accepted. No paper registration. Last deadline for all registrations is February 7, 2022.

Races are open to participants:

- Without any ski license, who will receive from the organization an FFS day license number, provided after the registration (see non-licensed entry fees) + a medical certificate of less than 12 months.
- Members of the French Ski Federation 2021-2022 (competitor, club leader or leisure license) + a medical certificate of less than 12 months for club leader or leisure licenses only.
- Members of the International Ski Federation (FIS) 2021-2022.
- Members of a foreign cross-country skiing Ski Federation (ESP, AND, SUI) 2021-2022 + a medical certificate of less than 12 months.

These documents are not necessary for the Transju'Expérience (no medical certificate and no license necessary)

Only cross-country skiing licenses in the above Ski Federations are accepted.
 On the medical certificate of less than 12 months must be written clearly that you are « apt to take part in a long-distance sport (or cross-country skiing) competition ».

2.2 ENTRY FEES

Services included in the entry fee:

- bib number
- souvenir gift
- Transju' guide
- stickers for your skis
- timing chip (all events) and timed ranking (except for Transju'Expérience)
- finisher medal at the finish line
- medical and safety services
- partial refund if the event is cancelled by the Organizing Committee
- food stations
- ski-check at the finish area
- clothing bag transported from the start area to the finish area
- technical assistance
- track preparation / grooming

Entry fees are decided each year by the Organizing Committee.

3. INSURANCE / CANCELLATION / REFUND / BIB NUMBER CHANGES

3.1 INSURANCE

Non ski licensed participants are advised to subscribe to an individual complementary insurance covering the risks of practicing in cross-country skiing competition.

3.2 CANCELLATION FROM THE ORGANIZATION

Delay for announcing a cancellation is set for 6 days before the beginning of the events. Nevertheless, the events cannot be cancelled less than 3 hours before the start of the event except for security reasons endangering participants, organizers, or officials.

3.3 REFUND OF ENTRY FEES

Only the three following cases will be considered for a partial refund of race entry fees. No other reason can be invoked by the participant.

➤ In the case of cancellation linked to sanitary Covid-19 situation (decision from the State services)

For all races, the amount of 90% of the payed entry fee will be refunded. No necessary steps need to be taken by the skiers.

➤ In the case of cancellation by the organization for another reason

For all races, the amount of 50% of the 1st entry fee (until 15/11/2021) will be refunded. No necessary steps need to be taken by the skiers. This amount allows the organizers to cover the expenses already paid.

100% of the amount of the FFS day ticket of 15€ for non-licensed skiers and 100% of the optional service will be refunded.

In case of cancellation the day of the race, in case of major force, any refund will be made. The total amount of expenses is already paid by the organizer.

➤ In the case of cancellation from the participant

Participants may request partial refund in the case of a death, accident, or illness (included Covid-19) of the participant or the participants partner or a first-degree descendant or ascendant. The participant must provide the organization with the necessary documents (medical certificate, death certificate) on the day of the request or within 2-days of the request. The amount of the entry fees to be refunded are as follow:

- 50% of the entry fee amount up to December 31, 2021
- 30% of the entry fee amount from January 1st, 2022 until January 22, 2022, included.

No refund request will be considered after January 23, 2021.

All refund requests will be treated as soon as possible. All requests sent after January 10, 2022, will be processed after the event.

The request must send by email at contact@latransju.com.

3.4 START NUMBER CHANGE

Participants have the right to transfer his/her registration rights (not the bib number) to another skier or to change events. The deadline for all changes is on Wednesday, February 2, 2022, at midnight, under the following conditions:

- having send the request by email at contact@latransju.com, before the deadline
- that there are available bib numbers in the race requested at the time of the request
- payment of a 20€ administrative fee has been made at the time of the request
- in the case of a change in racers, the new racer must provide the mandatory documents at the time of the request

After Wednesday, February 2, 2022, at midnight, no more changes will be accepted.

4. START NUMBER PICKUP AND TIMING

4.1 START NUMBER PICK UP

Start number pick-up takes place in the International Nordic Fair: Friday, 11 and Saturday, 12 February 2022 from 9 am to 7 pm

4.2 TIMING

You are equipped with an electronic chip. Be careful not to damage the chip and to return it after the competition before exiting the finish stadium.

A 20€ fee will be billed by the timekeeping company for any electronic chip that is not returned, lost, or deteriorated. It is the competitor's responsibility to return the electronic chip at the end of the race and at the very latest, 15 days after the event.

Bib numbers are personal and non-transferable without prior authorization from the Organizing Committee, doing so will result in disqualification.

The Organizing Committee assumes no liability or responsibility for participants racing under the name of another person (identity theft).

Law dating from March 12, 2012, added to the Criminal code, article 313-6-2 sanctioning a 15'000 € fine « for the sale or intending to sell or any other form of transfer, whether free of charge or not, the entry rights to any sporting event without the authorization of the Organizing Committee ».

No markings should appear on the bib numbers except for those of the official race sponsors.

5. STARTING BLOCKS AND SCHEDULE / START AND FINISH STADIUM

5.1 START WAVES AND SCHEDULE

The assigned starting blocks are determined by the Race Director and according to:

- 1- previous Transjurassienne results (last 2 editions held, 2018 and 2019)
- 2- FIS points for athletes who have provided an active FIS code
- 3- results of a long-distance Worldloppet race (last 2 editions held).
- 4- FFS points for licensed FFS competitors
- 5- results of the following French competitions of the last edition held.
 - Envolée Nordique / - Foulée Blanche / - Marathon de Bessans / - Traversée du Massacre

Honorary titles are given to our faithful returning competitors honouring them with a preferential start position:

- Senator, for participants having finished all Transjurassienne editions (long version), a total of 35 Transjurassienne participations in 2021.
- Grand'Ambassador, participants having finished a minimum of 27 editions (long version) in 2021.
- Ambassador, participants having finished a minimum of 17 Transjurassienne editions (long version) in 2021.

Starting block will be available on start list from the middle of January. **No blocks changes will be made after January 30, 2022.** For any starting block changes before this date skiers have to send the request by email at contact@latransju.com.

It is the racer's responsibility to enter the start wave zone corresponding to his/her start number. Athletes taking start in a wave that is not assigned to him/her will be facing a time penalty or disqualification, decided on by the Organizing Committee.

5.2 START AND ARRIVAL STADIUM

The start stadium will be opened 1h before the 1st start (to allow the mandatory control) and will be closed 15 minutes after the last start. The opening of boxes can be delayed for security reasons on the course.

The arrival stadium will be closed at 5.30 pm on Saturday and on Sunday.

6. RACER OBLIGATIONS / PROTESTS / APPEALS

6.1 RACER OBLIGATIONS

The Organizing Committee is authorized to apply time penalties or disqualify competitors in the case of non-sportsman behaviour, for non-respect of the present race regulations or of the classic technique for the races on Saturday, in the case of non-respect of volunteers, members of the organization, sponsors and in the case of throwing litter outside the zones provided by the organization, skiing outside the course or any degradation of the fauna and flora. Race officials will be present along the racecourse ensuring that the present rules are followed.

As in any sporting event, all participants may be subject to an anti-doping control. Participants who refuse to be controlled will immediately be disqualified.

6.2 PROTESTS AND APPEALS

Protests can be filed to the organization according to conditions mentioned in article 387 of the ICR. CHF 100. – or the equivalent in another valid currency must be deposit with the submittal of the protest according to article 361.4 of the ICR. This deposit will be returned if the protest is upheld.

An appeal may be filed according to the guidelines in article 387 of the ICR.

7. CUT-OFF TIMES AND WITHDRAWAL

All skiers must pass all check points to be ranked. Any participant who does not pass them in the indicated times or who chose to stop the race has to inform the closest member of the organization (food stations, race first aid...) then, the timing chip will be removed, and the competitor will be transported to the finish area.

Participants are then no longer under the responsibility of the Organizing Committee.

For all events, participants must complete the entire course on skis, in classic technique on Saturday and in free style on Sunday.

Time schedules may evolve for security reasons. For the same reason, additional cut-off times may be implemented.

After 1:30 pm, the organization reserves the right to stop skiers for a few seconds to allow vehicles cross the road in Chaux-Neuve if necessary, depending on traffic conditions. This decision will be taken by the Race Director.

Consult the cut-off time schedule for Saturday and Sunday on the website www.latransju.com.

8. MEDICAL SECURITY AND SAFETY

8.1 MEDICAL GUIDELINES

Participation in La Transjurassienne requires physical training and cross-country ski technique. Competitors must be in sufficient physical condition for the race distance chosen.

A medical visit is strongly advised. A medical certificate is mandatory for all participants who are not holders of an FFS or FIS competitor's ski license to obtain a medical certificate attesting to be « **apt to take part in a long-distance sport (or cross-country skiing) competition** ».

Participants must take special care in sunny conditions (eye protection, sufficient hydration) or in intense cold conditions, inferior to -10°C (eye protection, adapted clothing)

The organization will provide recommendations according to the weather conditions forecasted before the events. It is the participants responsibility to consult and implement the organization's recommendations. If the temperature is -25°C over the entire distance or the majority of the course, the start of the event may be delayed or cancelled.

8.2 SAFETY PLAN

The safety and medical plan is mobile and set up in close consideration of the characteristic of the race course from start to finish to insure the security of all participants.

9. PRIZE-GIVING CEREMONY

After the Transju'Classic, on Saturday and La Transjurassienne, on Sunday, the first 3 men and first 3 women must be present in the mixed zone for the official flower's ceremony and interviews, after the 3rd arrival. Skiers have to wear their bib numbers in a visible manner.

Detailed information concerning racer awards and time schedule are available on the website www.latransju.com.

Competitors who do not attend the prize-giving ceremonies without a legitimate excuse (accepted by the Organizing Committee) lose their claim to any prize, including the prize money. **Competitors called to the podium during the official prize-giving ceremony, must wear bib numbers in a visible manner.**

No prize-giving will take place outside the official prize-giving ceremony.

10. PRACTICAL INFORMATION

Practical information concerning transportation, food stations, traffic restriction and advice, clothing bags, waxing etc. are available on the website www.latransju.com.

11. ACCEPTANCE / MODIFICATION / INTERPRETATION OF THE RACE RULES

11.1 ACCEPTANCE OF THE RACE RULES

All competitors must read and accept the present race rules and regulations. In registering in any events of La Transjurassienne, the participant acknowledges to have fully read the present rules regulations and accepts all aspects without reserve.

The Organizing Committee can in no way be held responsible in the case of an accident, an incident caused by poor health or insufficient physical preparation. The Organizing Committee declines responsibility for lost items, theft or damage to personal equipment during transportation, before, during or after the event.

For any point not covered in the present regulation, the Cross-Country Book of the FIS International Ski Competition Rules (ICR) will be considered.

11.2 MODIFICATION OF THE RACE RULES

The Organizing Committee reserves the right to modify points of the present regulation, if necessary, in case of exceptional circumstances that may occur.

The Jury of Competition has the authority to take measures not provided for or not foreseen in the present regulation. The Jury reserves the right to modify the start and/or the itinerary if conditions justify.

The Jury reserves the right to modify the race schedule in function of the weather conditions.

11.3 INTERPRETATION OF THE RACE RULES

The Organizing Committee has the power to decide on any point not foreseen in the present regulation.

Only the original French version of the present regulation will be recognized as valid in the case of discussion of the interpretation of the race regulation.

The Jury of Competition reserves the right to program several starts.

12. IMAGE RIGHTS AND GENERAL DATA PROTECTION REGULATION

12.1 IMAGE RIGHTS

Each participant authorizes the Organizing Committee of La Transjurassienne events and their beneficiaries (sponsors, media) to use photographs, videos, multimedia, or film likeness in which they may appear, taken while participating in La Transjurassienne events. The organization reserves the right to use the images on all support documents, promotional and/or advertising, anywhere in the world for the longest amount of time legally allotted, including eventual prolongations that may be applied to that period.

12.2 GENERAL DATA PROTECTION REGULATION

Conforming to the May 25, 2018, GDPR law, personal participant details will be used in the racer data base, for archives, start lists and result lists, photography services, in newspapers, sponsor magazines and to send informational newsletters. Participant personal data will be managed by a data supervisor in the Trans'Organisation office. Participants have the right to access and to rectify their personal data.

RACE REGULATIONS – ANNEX

SPECIFIC REGULATIONS
ADAPTIVE ATHLETE PARTICIPATION

Reservations: The Organizing Committee reserves the right to modify points of the present regulation under exceptional circumstances that may occur.

All events of La Transjurassienne are open to adaptive athletes under the conditions specified below.

Trans 25CT and Trans 25FT

La Trans 25FT will be the reference event for a specific adaptive skier ranking. Both events are open to all adaptive athletes:

- Visually-Impaired skiers will take their start with a 5-minute anticipated start time placed in front of the first wave.
- Stand-Up skiers will be integrated in the race with non-adaptive athletes. The start wave will be assigned according to the same criteria as for non-adaptive athletes (cf. La Transjurassienne race regulations).
- Sit skiers (using a sit ski) will take the start just after the last wave.

La Transju'Classic

This event is open to all adaptive skiers:

- Visually-Impaired skiers will take their start with a 30-minute anticipated start time placed in front of the elite wave.
- Stand-Up skiers will be integrated in the race with non-adaptive athletes. The start wave will be assigned according to the same criteria as for non-adaptive athletes (cf. La Transjurassienne race regulations).
- Sit skiers (using a sit ski) will take the start just after the last wave.

La Transjurassienne

This event is open to all Stand-Up and Visually-Impaired skiers. This event is not open to Sit skiers.

- Visually-Impaired skiers will take their start with a 30-minute anticipated start time placed in front of the elite wave.
- Stand-Up skiers will be integrated in the race with non-adaptive athletes. The start wave will be assigned according to the same criteria as for non-adaptive athletes (cf. La Transjurassienne race regulations).

Cut-off times

Cut-off times are implemented by the Race Director along the race course to guarantee participant's security. Competitors who does not reach one of these points before the cut-off time, cannot hope to reach the finish line before dark.

All skiers must pass all check points to be ranked.

Competitors who do not go through the electronic check points within the set time frames will not be ranked.

Any skier who does not pass these stations within the indicated cut-off times will be transported by Organizing Committee to the finish area.

Participants are then no longer under the responsibility of the Organizing Committee.

Registration deadline

The last delay for all entries is on **Monday, February 7, 2022**.

Please refer to La Transjurassienne Race Regulations for all other points not covered in Annex 1, they are identical for all participants.
